It is made from 100% Pecorino grapes at a high altitude in the Abruzzo region of Italy. It is definitely worth it to branch out from Pinot Grigio and try something new. Then we have a Rioja and did you know Rioja doesn't need to be just a red wine! Rioja blanco wines are exceptionally rare as it makes up only 10% of the regions production and this one does not disappoint. Next, one of my favourites from De Bortoli who are one of Australia's largest and oldest wine makers. Whilst they have been making wine for years, they haven't lost its touch. **Pehhcora Pecorino Terre di Chieti** (125ml)

*(Italy) ripe peach and mango fruits, hints of spice and good minerality. A must try for Pinot Grigio drinkers. Paired well with white fish, risotto and chicken.*

**Rioja Blanco CVNE Monopole** (125ml)

*(Spain) fresh dry, unoaked fruit forward and delightfully fresh and crisp. A true Spanish white classic from one of the oldest Rioja producers. Paired well with shellfish, salads and grilled fish.*

**De Bortoli Deen Vat 5 Botrytis Semillion** (125ml)

*(Australia) medley of citrus, nectarine, and quince fruit. Good levels of sweetness and refreshing acidity. Paired well with cheese boards and chocolate desserts.*

# Red Wine & Port Flight

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The Douro Valley in Portugal is a region known for idyllic landscapes for making wine and having the largest diversity of grape varieties. Whilst they got their name for its port, this rich red wine will not disappoint. 11th Hour Zinfandel gets its name from the winemakers who make their decisions in harvesting, the fermentation period and barrel aging at the last minute (in the '11th Hour'). Whilst California may not be the first thought for wine, this Zinfandel is definitely worth a try! Taylor's is one of the oldest and most recognised producers of port, dating all the way back to 1692. Bartholomew Bearsley (the founder) became the first British wine shipper to buy a property in the Douro. As I am sure the Douro Tinto red did not disappoint, neither will this Tawny Port. **Next Station Douro Tinto** (125ml)

*(Portugal) full of ripe rich fruit with a generous palate, soft and spicy - a classic example of red wines typical of this lovely steep and sided and terraced valley. Paired well with steak, game-meat, any beef dish.*

**11th Hour Zinfandel** (125ml)

*(California) intense blackberry and spicy characters dominate the nose. Gentle tannins with a rich sweetness on the palate with a lingering finish. Paired well with pasta dishes, spicy dishes, burgers, lamb.*

**Taylor's Tawny Port** (125ml)

*(Portugal) mellow nose of succulent ripe berry fruit with aromas of butterscotch, figs and prunes interwoven with attractive nutty and spicy aromas. Smooth and round on the palate, full of rich strawberry jam flavours. Paired well with cheese, crème brûlée, custard desserts.*

## **Talisker 10 Year Old Scotch Whisky** (25ml)

*Talisker is produced at the oldest distillery on the Isle of Skye – it has been made by the sea since 1830. The Isle of Skye is one of the most remote, windswept yet beautiful landscapes in Scotland and this is reflected in every sip. It is a powerful single malt whisky with a sea salty nose, spicy complexity, smoky sweet character and a signature peppery finish.*

## **Lagavulin 16 Year Old Scotch Whisky** (25ml)

*Lagavulin is known as “The King of Islay” where it is distilled. It is an ‘essential’ Scotch Whisky that any connoisseur or enthusiast must have in their collection; one of the world’s favourite Malt Whiskies. Aged in oak casks for at least 16 years, this much sought-after Single Malt has the massive peat-smoke flavour that’s typical of southern Islay.*

## **Glenkinchie 12 Year Old Scotch Whisky** (25ml)

*Glenkinchie is celebrated as a light and delicate whisky. Its light character is born from its distillation in some of Scotland’s largest stills; matured for 12 years, the result is a light, floral whisky with a fresh, creamy taste.*

## **Oban 14 Year Old Scotch Whisky** (25ml)

*The tiny lamp glass-shaped copper pot stills that make Oban’s Scotch are among the smallest in Scotland, and the liquor they distill is slowly condensed in wooden worm tubs outside among the rooftops, exposed to the salted sea air, bringing a distinct depth of flavour.*

## **Ludlow Stolen Youth Whisky** (25ml)

*Taken from the whisky cask before Ludlow can officially call it single malt whisky, this single malted spirit ‘Stolen Youth’ is lovingly handcrafted in the heart of the Welsh Marches. Using only two ingredients, the finest Scottish malted barley and purified water, Ludlow carefully triple-distil this fine spirit and then age it in American bourbon casks.*

## **Penderyn Madeira** (25ml)

*An award winning single malt whiskies on the foothill of the Brecon Beacons National Park in Wales. The village of Penderyn was chosen because of the site’s own supply of fresh natural spring water. Penderyn Madeira is the original Penderyn ‘house style’ aged in ex-bourbon barrels and finished in ex-Madeira wine casks to bring out its full gold character.*

## ALLAN SCOTT Family Winemakers

Nobody has more experience of growing grapes in Marlborough than Allan Scott. Allan was instrumental in the initial planting of the region's most famous vineyards and hasn't strayed very far from his roots, with Allan Scott's cellar situated on Jackson Road, across from the vineyards of Cloudy Bay.

Back in 1973 viticulture in Marlborough was just beginning, Allan was one of its first pioneers. Allan and his wife Catherine first purchased land in what was to become known as Marlborough's "Golden mile", planting the entire property with vines. Armed with his passion for viticulture, a thirst for knowledge and sheer hard work and determination he produced some of Marlborough's best vines and developed local techniques which are now the basis of standard viticultural practice in New Zealand.

In 1989 with a wealth of experience from successfully contracting out his precious grapes Allan felt it was time to venture into the wine making world himself. Further land purchases were made and Allan Scott Family Winemakers was born.

The operation today couldn't be more family focussed. Allan's son Josh heads up the Winemaking Team. The vineyards were Josh's playground as a boy and after graduating he spent time working in some of the most famous wine regions of the world. After his return home followed by a very successful foray into the world of brewing, establishing Moa Beer as a household brand in New Zealand, Josh joined the family business and has been a constant in bringing innovative and transformative changes resulting in the modern and cutting edge winery Allan Scott is proud to be today.

Josh's sisters Victoria and Sara are also fundamental parts of the team. Victoria is responsible for Marketing and Sarah is a qualified winemaker so works closely with her brother Josh.

# Agustín Lanús WINES

## Agustin Lanús Wines

*"Many say that driving 9 hours into the mountains on dangerous dirt roads just to check on our grapes is crazy, but then they try the wine and they understand."*

*Argentine agricultural engineer turned winemaker, Agustin Lanús, is not only a sommelier but a Master of Science in Viticulture and Oenology from the highly respected Vinifera Euro Master program, so it would be fair to say he knows what he is doing.*

*Having worked at some of the top wineries the world has to offer, Ceretto, Chateau Beychevelle, Rutini, KWV, to name but a few, in 2006 Agustin ventured deeper into his homeland, namely to the Calchaqui Valley to learn about the unique micro-terroirs found at extreme altitudes.*

*What he has gone on to achieve since those first explorative days is truly remarkable. Producing wine from vineyards that are anywhere between 1,650 to 3,100 meters above sea level, when you consider European vines are grown in the region of 1,300 meters, it beggars belief that vines can thrive. Grapes take longer to mature at this altitude which results in their skins becoming thicker and accompanied by low yield harvests Agustin is able to expertly craft incredibly complex and full-bodied wines. The vineyards located in Salta, Tucuman and Santa Maria produce wines with such purity of fruit they truly of showcase, and are a testament to, the extraordinary expression achievable with extreme altitude winemaking - taste and you will understand.*
